PASTOR'S LETTER



For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord,
plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.

Jeremiah 29:11

Pastor Kevin is leaving.

I've had a bit longer to get used to the idea than you have. Pr. Kevin invited me to be a part of his discernment process months ago. I still didn't know it was going to happen until it happened – until the vote at St. Matthew's in Wauwatosa made it so. But having been in conversation with him, I can tell you that I do believe this process has been led by the Holy Spirit. I am confident that God has an exciting future planned for Pr. Kevin and St. Matthew's together. But that doesn't change that I'm going to miss him.

Here at Atonement, the next steps of our transition process are already in the works. Our Congregation Council will be meeting with The Rev. Kristin Nielsen from the Greater Milwaukee Synod on Tuesday, February 13th. At that meeting she will walk us through the general flow of a pastoral transition process, and discuss with us some of the ways our process will be different from the norm ("normal" here having been designed for congregations with a solo pastor).

The Rev. Nielsen has already shared with me that one of the differences will be my involvement – unlike when a solo or senior pastor leaves, when an associate pastor leaves often the senior pastor takes on many of the roles an interim pastor usually has in guiding the transition process. I expect we will still have someone come in to help with pastoral duties in Pr. Kevin's absence.

While I am eager to get our transition process started, I also know that we are in good shape as a congregation and have no need to rush the process.

We will be sharing more information as it becomes available in the weeks ahead, much of it after council meets with The Rev. Nielsen on Feb. 13th. We'll be sharing information about how we will celebrate Pr. Kevin's ministry with us for the past six years, and say our final goodbyes. As you know from his resignation letter, his time with us will be over quickly – his last day in the office being February 22nd, and his last Sunday with us being February 25th. I would mark that Sunday on your calendar if you haven't already, and plan to be with us in worship if you can.

Lastly, I want to thank you for being the congregation you are. While it may seem like Pr. Kevin is leaving after just a short amount of time, I left my first call after only 2 years. That was slightly longer than average back then (and I believe the average has decreased in the many years since). For Pr. Kevin to have stayed here at Atonement for just short of 6 years is a testament to both Atonement and Pr. Kevin. This is a good place to do ministry. Thank you. You've been a place where Pr. Kevin could grow into his role as pastor and safely experiment, both teaching and guiding him as well as allowing him to lead. I am sure we will now also help him leave well – even as we continue to be partners in the gospel with him.

NEW FEES?! IMPORTANT REALM UPDATE

Several of you have noticed and asked about what look like new fees attached to giving online with our new Realm giving portal, and wondered why we are being charged fees now when we weren't before.

While it looks like we are now being charged fees with Realm that we weren't charged before, the reality is that we have always been charged fees for giving done with credit cards or by bank transfers (ACH transfers). Depending on who processed the gift (which previously could have been Vanco, run by Thrivent, for Simply Giving; Breeze; or PayPal for one-time gifts given through the Jotform on our website), we may have been paying a monthly fee for their processing in addition to a flat fee per transaction, a percentage of each transaction, or both. With the exception of gifts through Breeze, these costs were not revealed to anyone making a gift. Only in Breeze would you have seen an option to offset the processing fees by making a slightly larger donation.

Now, if you give through our online giving portal in Realm, you will see an option you can check that says, "Contribute an extra \$x to help offset processing costs." If you give through an ACH Transfer (from your checking account), the extra amount will be 1% of your gift. With Breeze it was slightly higher (1% + \$.30).

You are not required to give this extra amount. These transaction fees are simply the cost of doing business in a digital world. Anywhere you use a credit card, and anywhere you make a bank transfer, businesses pay these fees. The only way to avoid them is to use cash or checks – which some small businesses still limit themselves to.

If you do choose to give the extra amount to help cover these fees, thank you. Even with a budget as large as ours, little things add up. I choose to cover these fees when I give because I like to think that all of my intended giving is going toward ministry. But just like the choice of how much to give back to God through Atonement, whether you decide to help offset our processing costs is your choice.

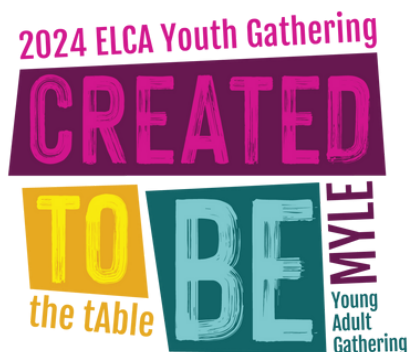
