PASTOR'S LETTER



At Mt. Horeb] the angel of the Lord appeared to [Moses] in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight and see why the bush is not burned up." When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am."

Exodus 3:2-4

In the Narrative Lectionary that we are following we catch highlights from the book of Acts each Sunday during the season of Easter. We're following the original narrative in that way – Jesus rose from the dead, his followers started trying to figure out what that meant, and the whole time they were trying to play catch-up because the Holy Spirit was already out ahead of them. That's my one-line synopsis of the Book of Acts: the early church trying to catch up to what the Holy Spirit was doing in the world.

Thinking about how that must have felt for those earliest followers of Jesus, the story of Moses and the burning bush often comes to mind. What usually gets lifted up as the amazing part of this story is that Moses happened upon a burning bush. But apparently this wasn't actually that strange – I've read in several places that finding a random bush burning in the desert was somewhat common. What was strange about this bush is that, although it was burning, it was not being burned up.

The text is also quite clear that God waited until after Moses noticed the bush and turned to take a closer look before calling out to him. It always makes me wonder – how many other times had God appeared where Moses could have noticed, but didn't?

In the story of Acts, at least the followers of Jesus were getting better at noticing what God and the Holy Spirit were up to. They were still trying to catch up – but at least they knew they were trying to catch up to what God was doing.

How good are we at noticing when God is present? How well do we track the movement of the Holy Spirit in our midst? While these are always important questions for congregations, they are even more so for us now as we work to hire a new Communications Coordinator, a new Youth Director, and begin the process of considering what are needs are related to calling a new pastor. What future ministries do we need to be preparing for now? What will it look like to be partners in God's mission a year or two from now? Five or ten years from now?

While these questions can be daunting, I also find them exciting. Because God IS up to something. And God DOES want us to be involved in what God is up to. This isn't about God trying to trick or to trap us. This is about God hoping for the chance to say, "Hey, I'm glad you decided to join me – I've got a great idea that I've been hoping you would help with." Could anything be better... more exciting... more fulfilling... than working with God to achieve what God has planned?

CYFM UPDATE

CHILDREN YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY COMMITTEE UPDATE

We are well into the spring season, which means LOTS of things are happening, being planned, and wrapping up. Our Children, Youth, and Family (CYF) Committee meet for the first time this year, and were able to welcome our new council representative Laura Brogan. We made plans for honoring our graduating high school seniors early this summer, heard about some of the plans for our TWO youth trips this summer (New Orleans for the triennial ELCA Youth Gathering, and Minneapolis for a YouthWorks service trip), and discussed recruitment, training, and support for our many volunteers who do such a wonderful job working with our children and youth.

We would like to express our gratitude to all of you who have responded so generously to our various fundraising efforts to support this summer's two youth trips. We look forward to sharing more details about those trips as they get closer, and to sharing with you about those trips after the youth return!

We also recommitted to reading together the book Growing Young: Six Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church (Powell, Mulder, and Griffin). This is the same book that our staff read together last summer.

Our CYF Leader Task Force is getting ready to have their first meeting in the next few weeks. As part of assessing our current needs related to youth ministry this task force will also be reading the book Growing Young together. Having this shared understanding to how we will be approaching youth ministry moving forward will help align our search efforts and the work our CYF Committee continues to oversee.

In other news, I have met with our confirmation students, and parents, for two classes this spring, and we will have one more class before our summer break starts. As we continue to grow into our new curriculum from Faith Inkubators we will continue to make some changes to when we meet, how we meet, and maybe even who meets (such as having parents around once in a while, but not every time). I have enjoyed shaking off some of the cobwebs and getting back to confirmation ministry, and am already looking forward to starting up the program again with our students and parents next fall.

During the various transitions happening right now, we would appreciate your prayers for our CYF Committee and CYF Leader Task Force, all of our volunteers from Little Steps up through ACTS, and for wisdom and insight as we read Growing Young and chart the most faithful way forward for ministry to, and with, our children and youth. TEPEAGUA, EL SALVADOR UPDATE

Next year our partnership with Espiritu de la Paz (The Spirit of Peace) Lutheran Church in El Salvador will reach 25 years! During this time, Atonement members have consistently supported education by choosing to sponsor students in Tepeagua. These Atonement sponsors send funds to the families (\$25/month for elementary, \$40/month for middle school, \$50/month for high school, and \$100 per month for university students.) More significantly, sponsors and students correspond several times per year. Many build significant Christ centered relationships.

In El Salvador, education is free through the ninth grade (up to age 14), but only 82% of children make it this far. Six percent of Salvadoran children never attend any school. Only 33% of the children old enough for secondary school actually attend. Our sponsorship program has allowed Tepeagua students to get to higher grades than the national average. They are better prepared for life with more reading, math, and writing skills, even when they do not achieve school completion. For the past few years, Atonement has sponsored 32-38 students each year. In February, I visited Tepeagua and met with our current students and provided letters from the Atonement sponsors. It isn't unusual to receive additional requests to join the program from 1 or 2 families. Generally, we have been able to do this.

However, in 2024, I received requests from 17 students for inclusion in our program. This was unusual and frankly, a heart-breaking experience. I spoke with each family and promised to return to Atonement to present their need for help.

The background to this increased need is based on extremely high inflation in El Salvador. The worst inflation is in food and transportation. In addition to inflation, work opportunity has been on the decline. An average worker in regulated Salvadoran industries may earn \$300 per month. But this work is generally available to men and much of work done in El Salvador is "informal" where the employer can pay whatever they please. Even government-regulated work only pays slightly over \$1 per hour. Note: Economic indicators suggest the average Salvadoran is poorer now than 5 years ago. Of the 17 petitions I received, 14 were from single mother homes. These single women would have a very hard time finding work. If they found any employment, it would not pay for the childcare their absence in the home would necessitate. Salvadoran society does not require any type of child support when a parent (generally father) leaves the family. Nor is there any type of social safety net through the government.

I was unable to say yes to these families but did promise that we at Atonement would try to support them. The families were often in tears, and I came to realize I was speaking to mothers who were not eating so that their children could.




CALL PROCESS UPDATE

The council created this timeline graphic below for the congregation to understand where we are in the process of calling a new pastor to replace Pastor Kevin. As you know, we have been using pastors from the synods "pulpit supply" to help fill in with preaching a Sunday or two each month during this transition. We interviewed one transition pastor candidate in April and will be interviewing a second candidate the first week of May. As noted below in the graph, a Transition Pastor is like an Interim Pastor, however, a Transition Pastor does not need to help us with the call process since we have a Senior Pastor in place.

We are in the process of establishing a Mission Exploration Team (MET). They will organize some listening sessions to ask the congregation how we think God is calling us moving forward and complete the Mission Site Profile (MSP).

The council continues to discuss what we think the staffing model should look like (should we simply seek an Associate Pastor or is God calling us to focus on more of a youth pastor, part time pastor, or even a mission-based model with interns). Look for updates here as well as during our Sunday services each month.







FEBRUARY DONATIONS
