PASTOR'S LETTER



For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Jeremiah 29:11

Pr. Kevin is gone. His key has been turned in. Accounts he controlled for us have been reassigned. Last connections with leaders and last pastoral care visits have been done. His alb and stoles are gone from the closet we shared in my office.

I admit that thinking about this today feels both a bit daunting, and a bit freeing.

When the Congregation Council met this month we approved an amount for a compensation package for a transition pastor that is a bit less than what we were paying Pr. Kevin. This, along with what we perceive to be our top needs for this pastor to help us cover (like worship leadership & preaching, pastoral care...) have been shared with the synod. We now wait to see what pastors are available in the synod. This could take several months. In the meantime, expect to see some pulpit supply pastors here at Atonement in the near future.

A few notes about some of these terms I've already started to use: "pulpit supply" is the term we use for when a pastor comes in and is paid just to preach and lead worship. The weeks before Sundays we have a pulpit supply pastor I will be using the time that I would spend on sermon preparation on other responsibilities.

A "transition pastor" is like an interim pastor, with one primary difference. When Pr. Lynn was here as our interim pastor she filled the role left open by Pr. Greg when he left, and she also helped lead the process which created our Ministry Site Profile that was shared with candidates such as myself as well as working with the Call Committee on the call process. Transition pastors also fill a role left

open when a pastor leaves, but they do not have any responsibilities related to the call process – I as our senior pastor will have those responsibilities.

As we begin to grow into what comes next, I ask for your patience and your prayers. Until a transition pastor is in place, I will be handling all of our pastoral duties alone. I know that you know I can't do everything that Pr. Kevin and I were doing together. I ask that you remember this when it is your email or phone call that hasn't been returned. And feel free to remind me – I don't get offended if you ask a second time.

Please keep me, our Congregation Council, our staff, and other congregational leaders in your prayers. We are in good hands – but those hands are all a bit busier right now. We appreciate your prayers for wisdom, insight, strength, and patience.

If you have been thinking about getting more involved here at Atonement, this would be a great time to do so. We're still looking for a few people to help with organizing volunteers who help with worship, for volunteers to operate slides, for fellowship volunteers, and for people to help with aspects of pastoral care like our card ministry. You can contact me about any of these things, or contact someone directly involved in the ministry you feel moved to help with.

Our congregation and its ministries are in good hands – and they are in God's hands. That is why I am able to look forward toward our immediate future with hope and expectation, excited about what we will learn about ourselves, God, and one another as we navigate the changes ahead. I'm glad all of you are with us on that journey.

MIDWEEK HOLDEN EVENING PRAYER: NOW THROUGH MARCH 20TH

This Lent we are again offering the opportunity to stop and take a break from normal life in the middle of the week. At 4:30pm and 6:30pm we offer the chance to worship using the beautiful Holden Evening Prayer setting. Between services, from about 5:15 – 6:15pm, different groups at Atonement offer a meal and accept a free-will offering. Whether your week is a hectic race and you crave a chance to slow down and re-center yourself on God's love and grace, or you feel isolated all week and crave a chance to enjoy worship and fellowship with other believers, we hope you will join us.

Our texts each week will be scripture verses that focus on God's work in our world. What is God up to? What does God hope in Jesus to achieve? As we begin to think about calling a new pastor to serve and lead our congregation, these verses will start to give us a renewed sense of the work we will be inviting that pastor to join us in doing.

The style of the presentation of these scripture verses will be a simplified version of Lectio Divina (Latin for divine reading), an ancient spiritual discipline. Normally Lectio Divina would consist of a whole hour itself, spent mostly in silent prayer and reflection on a text which is read two or three times. We will only spend a couple of minutes in silence after each text is read, reading each text twice during worship. As a worshiper you are invited to simply listen, and let the words that are read take you wherever they take you. Maybe one particular phrase or image stands out. Maybe something grabs your attention so much you miss the rest of the reading. Maybe you are struck by something that is repeated in the text. Wherever you attention takes you, offer that time and those wonderings to God, and see if – and where – God leads.

CARE CARD MINISTRY—CONSIDER A NEW APPROACH

For over 20 years Lorraine Behling, God rest her soul, faithfully managed our Care Card Ministry. Lorraine said she took it over after Agnes Kingsbury's long term as leader before her. So, some may know, and some may not know, Atonement Church has, over the years, quietly and humbly enhanced the caregiving ministry with good old-fashioned cards sent the old-fashioned way. Care cards have gone out to comfort and celebrate people experiencing many and varied significant life events.

We are now considering how to best go forward with the Care Card Ministry. Initial inquiries about finding a new manager have failed to reach any one person to step into the traditional solo role. Further inquiries uncovered a different model for managing a Care Card Ministry. This different model relies upon the team approach. The team includes a pastoral staff contact person, a facilitator, and up to 12 team members. A team member may sign up for more than one month if they wish. The pastoral staff supports initial orientation, care card kit creation and set up, as well as providing regular names and situations appropriate for receiving a care card. The facilitator assists with creating and overseeing the care card kit and communicates with team members. The team members commit to one month (or more if they sign on for more than one month) service sending cards to people identified by pastoral care staff and communicated by facilitator. Oftentimes care cards are sent out in response to prayer chain requests.

Please prayerfully consider this ministry opportunity. Discern the value inherent in being remembered or acknowledged at times of joy and sorrow. Remember a time when someone remembered you and took time to let you know. Perhaps this old-fashioned way is out of date. Perhaps this old-fashioned way is still good for sharing God's love, grace and mercy at those times in life when it's just what we need!




