### PASTOR'S LETTER



For a child has been born for us, a son given to us. Isaiah 9:6

One of my favorite things about Christmas is the way so much of the world joins us in celebration. Yes, on the one hand, Christmas has become commercialized to an absurd degree. Hallmark has 42 new Christmas movies for this year – six of them appearing before Halloween. On the other hand, thousands and thousands of people who do not claim to be Christian, and who will not be in worship for Christmas, nevertheless spend lots of time and money to participate in one of the oldest Christmas traditions there is: giving presents.

Long before Jesus was born, the prophet Isaiah (among others) spoke of the coming Messiah. Isaiah claimed the child to be born was for us – a son who was given to us. Jesus, himself, is a gift. Jesus was not offered in trade. Jesus was not a down payment. Jesus was given, with no expectation of reciprocity – no strings attached.

The wise men from the east – most likely using information passed down by the wise Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego, and Daniel – brought gifts for the newborn King of the Jews. Again, there was no expectation of reciprocity. They did not seek favors from this king. Their goal was to honor the birth of this child. It is something many of us have done when friends and relatives have celebrate the birth of children.

As you go about your Christmas gift shopping this year (if you're done, great, just don't tell me), please keep in mind the opportunity to give a special gift through Atonement. Every year we offer this opportunity, usually with half of the gift staying at Atonement for some purpose, and half being given beyond Atonement. This year, gifts will be split between our own Capital Improvement Fund, and funding for roofs for people in Tepeagua, El Salvador.

You soon will be receiving by mail more information about this giving opportunity. I hope you consider this a particularly appropriate gift to honor the birth of Jesus, the newborn king, once again. May you have a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year, filled with the presence of our savior. Jesus.


#### **CONFIRMATION CLASSES**

### COUNCIL CORNER



#### LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

As we reflect on 2023 and think about where we are headed in 2024, I want to pause and thank our Congregation Council and staff. We were challenged with a Senior Pastor change, Contemporary Music Leader change, and other staff changes the past few years. That incredible amount of change was difficult, so it was nice to "normalize" a bit in 2023.

With that said, we suspect those headwinds and economic worries resulted in some decreased giving this past year. Our financial commitments for 2024 were also a little less than we hoped, so with increasing inflationary costs the Finance Committee and Executive Committee researched ways to balance a proposed 2024 Operating Budget. To make up that expected shortfall next year we weighed several options:

- 1. Refinance the mortgage This would have stretched out the mortgage term 15 years, at a higher rate and a substantial fee. This option would have improved our cash flow by almost \$7,000 a month. The cost of doing this, however, just didn't seem prudent.
- 2. Borrow from our restricted Memorial Fund, which is allowed by Atonement's constitution. We all concluded that this was just pushing out the cash flow issue to next year and would deplete our cash.
- 3. Reduce expenses We all are committed to the long-term success of Atonement through the current staffing model. Our member attrition rate could have been much higher with all the changes (we were told to expect over 20%), but we were blessed to quickly fill the open positions with an amazing Senior Pastor and Contemporary Music Leader along with other volunteers.
- 4. Re-Amortize the mortgage Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, our current lender, made the Council aware that since we had been paying ahead on the mortgage by two years, we could take the remaining balance and re-amortize it to the original term ending in January of 2029 (spread it out an additional two years from the planned early 2027 pay off). There is no fee to re-amortize the mortgage, and the interest rate stays the same. We were blessed as a congregation to have paid ahead due to previous Principal Payment Reduction campaigns, which provided us with this flexibility now, and we hope to hold another campaign at some point in the coming next few years.

The Council met on November 21st and voted to take advantage of the re-amortization option, thus lowering the annual mortgage payments by \$51,000. Since we re-amortized to the original term of the loan, a congregational vote was not needed.

On a more positive note, I hope everyone feels as good about our congregation as I do. As I write this update, it has never been more apparent to me how important the youth are to our congregation. The Faith Stories the confirmation students shared last month are always incredibly emotional (my eyes were sweating) .... and .... I have never been more Joyful in Hope, seeing nineteen students take their first communion the second Sunday of November with barely an open seat in the church. Thank you to the pastors, staff and volunteers that keep the Children, Youth and Family Program front and center.

### COUNCIL CORNER



#### **NOVEMBER COUNCIL REPORT**

The Church Council approved the re-amortization of Atonement's mortgage with Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, our current lender, due to reduced commitments that did not meet the expected 2024 Ministry Plan budget. The reduced monthly payment will allow Atonement to meet its budgetary commitments.

Council members learned by paying ahead on the mortgage, Thrivent will re-amortize the remaining mortgage balance, which will return to the original term date in January 2029. Since the mortgage was re-amortized to the original loan term date, a congregational vote was not needed. In addition, there is no fee to re-amortize the mortgage, and the rate remains unchanged. Please read the Church President Dave Franks' message in December's Atonement Bell newsletter for more information.

Stewardship representative Rachel Zabkowicz reported to Council members that this year's Stewardship Campaign received commitments from 176 giving units, as compared to 180 giving units last year. A total of \$671,000 was committed by the Atonement congregation to support the 2024 Ministry Plan budget.

President Dave Frank reported that the Nomination Committee is finalizing Council roles for next year in preparation for the Annual Congregational Meeting in January. The open Church Council positions are President-Elect/Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Administration/Personnel, Children, Youth and Family, and Outreach and Service.

I also attended a traditional service in November, and while I love our contemporary service and normally attend at 9:30am, the traditional service just felt good. I seem to be more of an early riser so no doubt I will be attending more of those services in the years to come.

With the church in a good place and stabilized, the Council will re-focus on more outreach efforts to grow our brand in the community to attract more new members. We would love to hear from any marketing experts in the congregation on ideas as we build that "marketing plan". We will also discuss internal options to focus on more unrestricted giving campaigns that help with the general cash needs of the church. Ideas like mortgage principal parties, Tell-a-Friend Sundays, more consistent usher presence, more new family orientations and many more ideas have been discussed.

In closing, I apologize for so much budget talk. Obviously, transparency is important. Many looked forward to a mortgage burning party in 2027, as did I, but that celebration will have to wait a couple more years.

Meanwhile, we move onward and upward, excited about the future and proud of our church for all the resources we continue to provide our community and the world.
