PASTOR'S LETTER



Welcome to 2024! Not only are we in a new year and this January is a month with a spirit of newness. As a church, we are welcoming a group of new members (Contact myself or Pastor Gene to let us know if you're interested) and celebrating a number of younger members of our community receiving their prayer bears, the next big step we offer in the faith journey of some of our littlest members.

This is also a moment of newness for me and my family. My daughter, Zoë, is getting baptized on January 7 and, with that, (officially) being welcomed into God's family. It took us a while to finally get Zoë baptized, in part, because Alissa and I struggled to decide on where to have Zoë be baptized. Since Alissa serves at Lake Park Lutheran Church and I am at Atonement, we did not want to have to choose between our two churches for where Zoë would be baptized. Furthermore, whenever we considered the possibility of baptizing Zoë at Atonement, I would get stuck a second time: at which service would Zoë be baptized? I worried that choosing any service at which to have Zoë baptized would suggest any a preference for that service—and I very much did not want to send that message.

As a result, Alissa and I decided it was easier to just opt to have Zoë baptized at Lake Park, as we would not also have to navigate between different services like we would have to at Atonement. While Zoë will not be baptized at Atonement, Alissa and I remain truly grateful and humbled by the love you showered upon Zoë. You have shown her that church is a place where she is loved, welcomed, and affirmed. Alissa and I hope and pray that this will continue to leave a mark on her as she grows up and her faith (hopefully) grows, too.

Chances are, Zoë is more widely known than the average young child in our church, as not every little one has their parent talking about them from the pulpit. That said, I hope the love, care, and support our family has felt is felt by every other family with a little one, including the ones receiving prayer bears later this month. I know that every little one is equally cherished and loved by God more than we can possibly comprehend.

I also hope our next little one also feels so loved, welcomed, and safe in church—yes, Alissa and I are expecting a second child. After experiencing infertility and miscarriage, we are overjoyed that our family is welcoming another little one, while also recognizing that we will have our hands full with two children under two! I look forward to see what God has in store for our family—and our church.


We will have another youth leader. As you will see in our materials for our Annual Meeting on January 14, we have budgeted for another youth leader and intend to hire one this year.

In our prior 5-year history, giving through Sept should be 76.4% of our annual plan. On 10/31/23, we are at 70.0%. Detailed financial reports are posted monthly in the office.
